### Forming the final grade for 'Basic Surgical Techniques'


According to the Bulletin the end of semester exam has an oral and a practical part. The students' activity during the semester, the results of self-control tests and the attendance on the lectures are also important in forming the final grade.

During the **practical exam** a scoring system will be used for evaluation of injection/blood sampling techniques, surgical scrubbing, gowning-glowing, behavioral rules in operating theatre, instrumental table order, instruments, as well as basic surgical interventions (e.g., suture, ligature, venous cutdown technique, removing stitches), with that 80% of the total score can be gained. At all the tasks the minimum requirement is 60%, respectively. Another 20% of the total scores come from the results of the two self-control tests. All these together will form the practical exam grade.

The final grade will be formed during the oral exam. It is influenced by the grade of practical exam and the evaluation of the tutor about the students' activity during the semester.

According to the importance of the topics the participation on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> week lectures is highly recommended.

Students who will attend at least 80% of lectures (11 out of 14 lectures), will get extra points; that can help to get better grade either during the practical or the oral exam in case of hesitation.
